Name: Robin TP3 **Date: 20 Sept 2024** Level: upper intermediate Number of students expected: 1-6 **Topic: Preferences: town or country** Main lesson focus (underline one): Grammar / Vocabulary / Pronunciation / Reading / Listening / Speaking / Writing Learner outcome(s): The students will be able to discuss the pros and cons of and express their preferences for living in the city or the country, using structures based on 'I prefer' and 'I'd rather...' and with topical vocabulary provided. **Grammar:** Structures using *prefer* and *would rather* (see Murphy: *English Grammar in Use*, 4th ed, unit 59) Vocabulary: way of life; close to the land; diverse; isolated; close-knit; sense of community **Phrases:** Materials: presentation text, practice materials, production exercise **Assumptions:** For this lesson I assume the Ss already know some vocabulary around city life and nature, have a roughly B2 range of vocabulary and grammar and are used to holding discussions with one another in English. An anticipated problem: My proposed solution: What I intend to work on based on previous feedback: time management, aiming for a 20-min split three ways between the three PPP stages. Clarity of instructions, separating modelling from instructing.
